An advisor must have at least 10 members to affiliate. Small rural schools may have 90% of total enrollment in the program if they have less than 10 students. For exceptions to the 10-member rule, you must contact the State Advisor. Charter registration forms may be found on the national website: www.bpa.org.

Texas advisors may have one Secondary Chapter and one Associate Chapter. Within the same class or classes an advisor may have both Secondary and Associate members.

Under current policy, Associate, Post-secondary and Middle Level Division members automatically advance to the State Leadership Conference. They may participate at the Regional Leadership Conference to prepare for the State Leadership Conference. Local advisors may set qualification standards.

The chart below indicates the breakdown for student and professional member dues.
